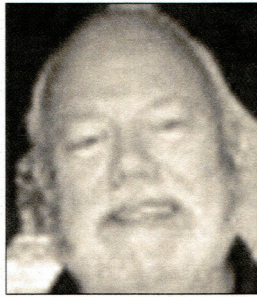

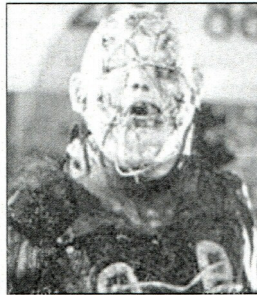

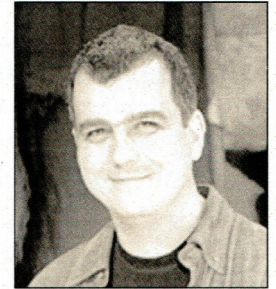


Peter Atkins – Peter was born in Liverpool, England and now lives in Los Angeles. He is the author of the novels *Morningstar*, *Big Thunder*, and *Moontown* and the screenplays *Hellraiser II*, *Hellraiser III*, *Hellraiser IV*, *Wishmaster*, and *Prisoners of the Sun*. His short fiction has appeared in such best-selling anthologies as *The Museum of Horrors*, *Dark Delicacies II*, and *Hellbound Hearts*. Magazine appearances include *Weird Tales*, *Fantasy & Science Fiction*, *Cemetery Dance*, and *Postscripts*. Last year’s *Spook City* was a three-author collection which featured Atkins alongside his fellow Liverpoolians Clive Barker and Ramsey Campbell. A new collection of his short fiction is to be published this year.



Sean Branney – Sean writes, produces and directs for screen, audio and theatre. In 1985 with collaborator Andrew Leman, he cofounded the H.P. Lovecraft Historical Society (“HPLHS” <http://www.cthulhulives.org>). Sean wrote the adaptation of Lovecraft’s celebrated

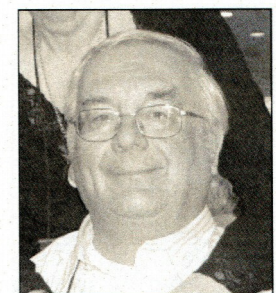
short-story *The Call of Cthulhu* as a silent film and co-produced it for the HPLHS. Sean’s co-written, produced and performed in many audio projects, including the HPLHS’ very popular *Dark Adventure Radio Theatre* CDs, a series of 1930s-style radio plays. Most recently Sean directed the forthcoming HPLHS motion picture *The Whisperer in the Darkness*.



Jason V Brock – Jason’s writing and art have been published Dark Scribe Press’ *Butcher Knives & Body Counts*, *Animal Magnetism*, *Calliope*, *Ethereal Tales*, San Diego Comic-Con International’s Souvenir Book and several other venues. He is Art Director/Managing Editor for *Dark Discoveries* Magazine. He co-edited the acclaimed anthology *The Bleeding Edge* with living legend William F. Nolan. He assists Mr. Nolan on various projects, such as the Bluewater Productions comics *Logan’s Run: Last Day* and *Dark Universe*. His films include the documentaries *Charles Beaumont: The Short Life of Twilight Zone’s Magic Man*; *The AckerMonster Chronicles*, and *Image, Reflection, Shadow: Artists of the Fantastic*. 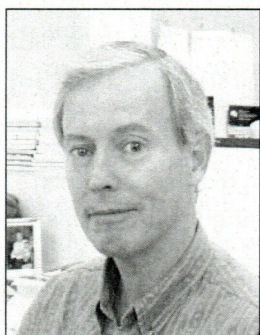


Ramsey Campbell – The *Oxford Companion to English Literature* describes Ramsey Campbell as “Britain’s most respected living horror writer”. He has been given more awards than any other writer in the field, including the Grand Master Award of the World Horror Convention, the Lifetime Achievement Award of the Horror Writers Association and the Living Legend Award of the International Horror Guild. Among his novels are *The Face That Must Die*, *Incarnate*, *Midnight Sun*, *The Count of Eleven*, *Silent Children*, *The Darkest Part of the Woods*, *The Overnight*, *Secret Story*, *The Grin of the Dark*, *Thieving Fear* and *Creatures of the Pool*. Forthcoming are *The Seven Days of Cain* and *Ghosts Know*. His collections include *Waking Nightmares*, *Alone with the Hor-*

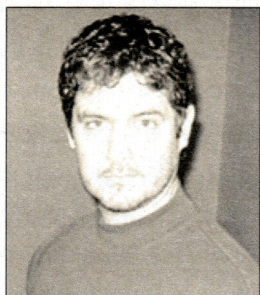


rors, *Ghosts and Grisly Things, Told by the Dead* and *Just Behind You*, and his non-fiction is collected as *Ramsey Campbell, Probably*. His novels *The Nameless* and *Pact of the Fathers* have been filmed in Spain. His regular columns appear in *Prism*, *All Hallows*, *Dead Reckonings* and *Video Watchdog*. He is the President of the British Fantasy Society and of the Society of Fantastic Films. Ramsey lives in Merseyside with his wife Jenny. His pleasures include classical music, good food and wine, and whatever's in that pipe. His website is at www.ramseycampbell.com.

Peter Cannon – Peter has written a number of works of Lovecraftian fiction, including *Pulptime*, *Scream for Jeeves*, *Forever Azathoth*, and *The Lovecraft Chronicles*. He is also the author of the critical study *H. P. Lovecraft and the memoir Long Memories* as well as the editor of *Lovecraft Remembered*. An augmented edition of *Forever Azathoth* is due from Subterranean Press in 2011. A native Californian who grew up mostly in Massachusetts, Cannon lives with his wife and three children in New York City, where he works as a reviews editor for *Publishers Weekly*.



Matt Cardin – Matt is the author of the horror fiction-and-nonfiction collection *Dark Awakenings* (2010) and the weird fiction collection *Divinations of the Deep* (2002), both of which cross into and out of Lovecraft territory with their explorations of religion and cosmic horror. His short fiction, essays, reviews, and interviews have appeared in *Cthulhu's Reign*, *Lovecraft Annual*, *The Children of Cthulhu*, *Dark Arts*, *Alone on the Darkside*, *The Thomas Ligotti Reader*, *The New York Review of Science Fiction*, *Cemetery Dance*, and elsewhere. He is a house reviewer for *Dead Reckonings*, the horror review journal edited by S.T. Joshi and Anthony Fonseca. He has a master's degree in religious studies and resides with his wife in Central Texas, where



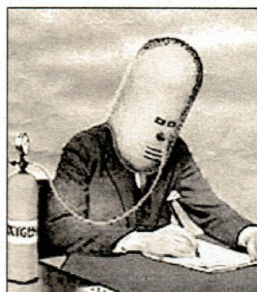
he teaches English and works in the Writing Center at a community college.

Lynn Cesar – Lynn is a New York native, artist and holographer who moved to San Francisco to work with Multiplex Co., the inventor of white-light holographic

Forthcoming works include an omnibus edition of published work from Centipede Press, and two new novels, *The Wretch of the Sun*, and *The Great Lover*. He lives and teaches in New York City.



Scott Connors – Scott Connors has been twice nominated for the International Horror Guild Award for his scholarly and critical writings. Along with Ron Hilger, he is editing the definitive edition of Smith's fantastic tales for Night Shade Books, the fifth volume of which is now at the printers. His reviews and essays have appeared in *Weird Tales*, *Publisher's Weekly*, *Lovecraft Studies*, *Studies in Weird Fiction*, *Nyctalops*, *Ghosts & Scholars Newsletter*, *All Hallows*, *Wormwood*, and the *Explicator* as well as such books as Don Herron's *The Barbaric Triumph*, Darrell Schweitzer's *The Robert E. Howard Reader*, *Icons of Supernatural Horror*, *A Warning to the Curious*, *Supernatural Literature of the World*, and *Encyclopedia of the Vampire*, the last four edited by S. T. Joshi.



He has also edited, with David E. Schultz, the Selected



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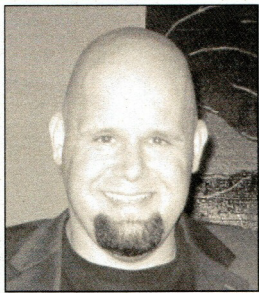

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Letters of Clark Ashton Smith for Arkham House, and *The Freedom of Fantastic Things: Selected Criticism on Clark Ashton Smith*. He was the first scholar to identify Lovecraft's role in the revision of Duane W. Rimel's story "The Tree on the Hill". Forthcoming are a revised and corrected edition of *A Century Less a Dream: Critical Essays on H. P. Lovecraft* and an edition of the legendary Lovecraftian fanzine *The Acolyte*. He lives in northern California not far from Clark Ashton Smith's home at Auburn.

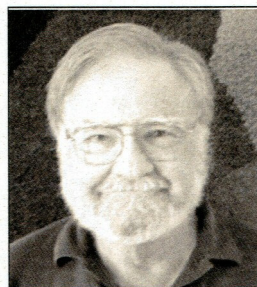
Richard Dakan – Rick lives, writes, and thinks in Sarasota, Florida, his home and native town. In the mid-90's he started writing for a living, and he hasn't stopped since. He scratched out a rewarding (if poor) living writing role-



playing game books for numerous product lines until 2000, when he came up with an idea for an online computer game which eventually became the hit 2004 release *City of Heroes* and helped found Cryptic Studios. His first novel, *Geek Mafia*, was published in 2006, followed by the sequels *Geek Mafia: Mile*

Zero in 2008 and *Geek Mafia: Black Hat Blues* in 2009. His fourth novel, *The Cthulhu Cult: A Novel of Lovecraftian Obsession*, was released in 2010. In 2010, he completed his Masters of Fine Arts in Creative Writing through the Ranier Writers Workshop at Pacific Lutheran University.

Walt DeBill – Walt is best known for his story "Where Yidhra Walks", which has inspired both a classical composition and a doom metal band. Since the dream that inspired *Yidhra* in 1971, he's watched the Mythos evolve from the restricted vision of August Derleth to the rich mosaic we have today. In recent years all of his stories have been collected in two ebook collections, *Tales of Awe and Terrible Beauty* and *The Mlandoth Myth*



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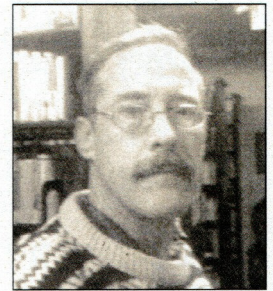
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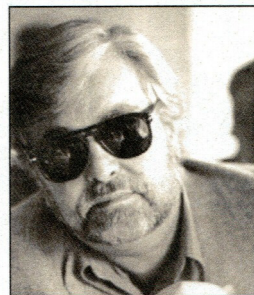

Jason Eckhardt – Jason is a native New Englander and self-taught artist. His interest in Lovecraft began on his 13th birthday (aeons ago) with a Lancer paperback of HPL's stories, gift of his sister Julie; and continues to this day. Mr. Eckhardt's illustrations have appeared in publications from Necronomicon Press, Arkham House, Dell Magazines, Centipede Press, Miskatonic River Press and others. He lives in New Bedford, Mass., with his wife, two stepdaughters and four cats, and his life is surrounded with beauty.



Dennis Etchison – Dennis is a three-time winner of both the British Fantasy and World Fantasy Awards. Some of his stories are included in the collections *The Dark Country*, *Red Dreams*, *The Blood Kiss*, *The Death Artist*,

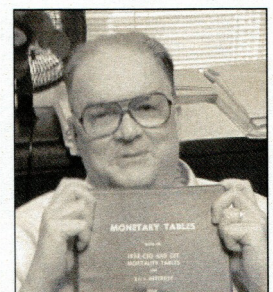


Talking in the Dark and *Fine Cuts*. Novels include *Darkside*, *Shadowman*, *California Gothic* and *Double Edge*, and several movie novelizations for John Carpenter and David Cronenberg. He edited the anthologies *Cutting Edge*, *Masters of Darkness I-III*, *MetaHorror*, *The Museum of Horrors* and (with Ramsey Campbell and Jack Dann) *Gathering the Bones*.

Since 2002 he has adapted 150 episodes of the original *Twilight Zone* TV series for *The Twilight Zone Radio Dramas* and is currently writing original scripts for the series. He served as President of the Horror Writers Association (HWA) from 1992 to 1994. His latest collection is *Got to Kill Them All & Other Stories* (CD Publications, 2009).

Ken Faig Jr. – Ken Faig, Jr. was born in Ohio in 1948 and discovered HPL's work in *Great Tales of Terror* and *The Supernatural* when he was in high school. With a brief interruption, he has belonged to the EOD since its foundation in 1973 and he founded his own Moshassuck Press to publish Lovecraftian micro-editions in 1987. He published several works including *Tales of the Lovecraft Collectors* (1995) with Necronomicon Press, and his collection *The Unknown Lovecraft* was published by Hippocampus Press in 2009.

Alan Dean Foster – Alan's writ-

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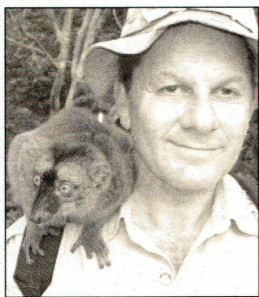
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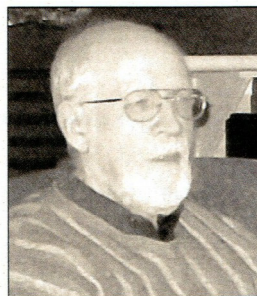
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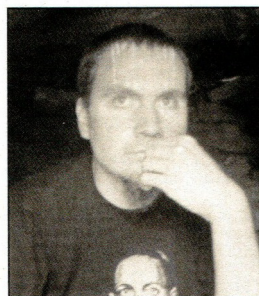
ing career began when August Derleth bought a long Lovecraftian letter of Foster's in 1968 and much to Foster's surprise, published it as a short story in Derleth's bi-annual magazine *The Arkham Collector*. Since then, Foster's published oeuvre includes more than 100 books. His novel *Cyber*

Way won the Southwest Book Award for Fiction in 1990, the first work of science-fiction ever to do so. He is the recipient of the Faust, the IAMTW Lifetime achievement award.

W. Paul Ganley – Paul originally chose to use this form of his name, at age fourteen, because he wanted to be a writer. He then started publishing in 1950, beginning with a fanzine (*Fan-Fare*). With two partners (as SSR Publications) he produced several booklets, including the mimeographed *Lovecraft Collectors Library* (George T. Wetzel: editor). After a hiatus (1956-1968), he began publishing *Weirdbook*. History repeated itself – he then published numerous books. He has two World Fantasy Awards and a Robert Bloch award. Retired now, he still publishes chapbooks. In-print items can be viewed in his eBay store, The Ganley Pub.

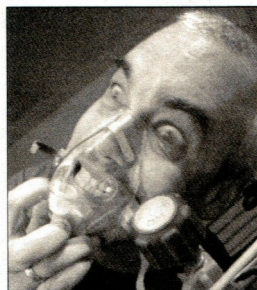


Richard Gavin – Richard is one of Canada's most acclaimed authors of weird and macabre fiction. His tales have garnered praise from genre notables such as Thomas Ligotti and Ramsey Campbell, and have been collected in the books *Charnel Wine*, *Omens*, and *The Darkly Splendid Realm*. He has also published several articles on magick and mysticism.

Cody Goodfellow – Cody is the author of *Radiant Dawn* and *Ravenous Dusk* and *Perfect Union*, and his short fiction has appeared in *Horrors Beyond*, *Hardboiled Cthulhu*, *Daikaiju*, *Monstrous*, *An-*



cient Shadows, *Cthulhu Unbound 3* and *Cthulhu 2012*. As the editor and cofounder of Perilous Press, he has worked with S.T. Joshi to publish new works of cosmic horror from Michael Shea, Brian Stableford and David Conyers.

Lois M. Gresh – Lois is the New York Times Best-Selling Author (6 times), Publishers Weekly Best-Selling Paperback Author, and Publishers Weekly Best-Selling Paperback Children's Author of 24 books and several dozen short stories. Her books have been published in approximately 20 languages.



Current projects include weird SF vampire thriller *Blood and Ice* (Jan 2011, Elder Signs Press), short story collection *Eldritch Evolutions* (March 2011, Chaosium), dark hardcover novel *Deadly Dimensions* (2011, Arkham House), an untitled volume from St. Martin's Press (2012); and editor of an anthology of original weird fiction (2013, Arkham House). Lois has received Bram Stoker Award, Nebula Award, Theodore Sturgeon Award, and International Horror Guild Award nominations for her work.

David Hayes – David is a genre actor/writer/producer/director. Most recently he has starred in *Machined*, *Reborn*, *Orville* and *Sportkill* (released by LionsGate with a theatrical run in Japan for *Sportkill*), *Jackrabbit Sky*, *The Death Factory Bloodletting* (via Well Go) and *Dark Places* (via Brain Damage Films). He has just produced and appears in the films *Cravings* and *Blood Moon Rising* (starring Ron Jeremy) and is in post-production on *The Prometheus Project* (starring David, Tiffany Shepis and Louis Mandylor), *Crushed Velvet* and *Bloody, Bloody Bible Camp*. His short film, "undone," is currently on the festival circuit and doing quite well. He recently wrapped on another short, "Five Days," that will be premiering soon.

David has written multiple feature films like *Back Woods*, *Vampegeddon*, *Riverdead*, and *Shower of Blood* as well as



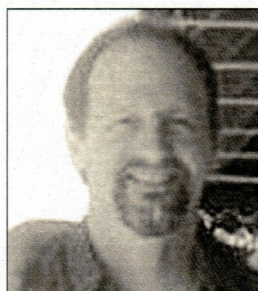


comic books (*Rottentail*, appearing 2011 and *Tranquility*, his new graphic novel), books (*Muddled Mind: The Complete Works of Ed Wood Jr.*) and writes for many genre magazines like *Videoscope*, *Cult Movies*, *Morpheus Tales*, *Brutarian* and more. His feature film screenplay, *Executive Privilege*,

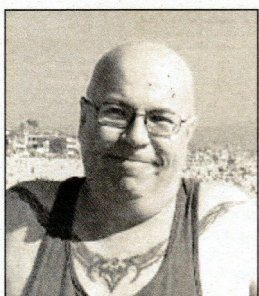
was a finalist in the 2010 Bridge International Screenplay Competition. David's stageplay, *Swamp Ho*, was a finalist in the International Cringefest and enjoyed an Off-Broadway Equity production in 2009.

He currently teaches screenwriting, film production, acting and rhetoric for Grand Canyon University, Glendale Community College and Kaplan University.

Ron Hilger – Ron is a Northern California native who has organized such Clark Ashton Smith related events as “The CAS Centennial Conference” in 1993 and “The CAS Plaque Dedication” in 2002. Hilger has also edited: *The Averoigne Chronicles* (in preparation, from Donald M. Grant Publishers), *Red World of Polaris* (with Scott Connors for Night Shade Books, 2003), and *Star Changes* (with Scott Connors for Darkside Press, 2005). Currently, Ron and Scott are completing the five-volume set, *The Collected Fantasies of Clark Ashton Smith*, also for Night Shade Books.



Chuck Hoffman – Charles is a pioneer in the field of Robert E. Howard studies, having co-authored the only book-length critical study of Howard's work to date. He has contributed to *The Dark Man: The Journal of Robert E. Howard Studies* and *The Cimmerian*, and provided the afterword to Del Rey's *The Best of Robert E. Howard, Vol. 1*. Hoffman has also written essays on H. P. Lovecraft for Robert M. Price's legendary *Crypt of Cthulhu* and contributed to a variety of cult publications including *Spectrum*, *Wrapped in Plastic*, and *Rave Reviews*. His young adult biography *Bruce Lee, Brandon Lee, and the Dragon's Curse* was published by Random House.

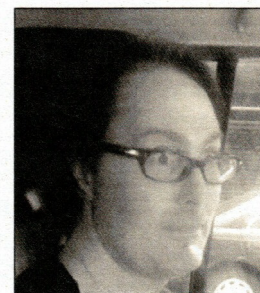


Derrick Hussey – Founder and editor of Hippocampus Press, he has worked closely with S. T. Joshi and David E. Schultz on a great many Lovecraftian projects. He is

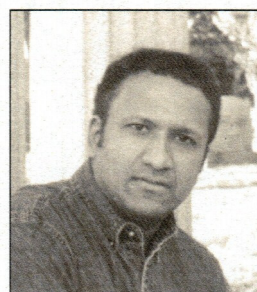
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a graduate of Colgate University (B.A.; M.F.P.), and a member of the Esoteric Order of Dagon amateur press association. He currently resides in New York City, where he has enlisted his very tolerant fiancée Anastasia to assist in all aspects of running Hippocampus. In addition to small press publishing, he works in substance abuse counseling and is a psychedelic music aficionado and cinema enthusiast.

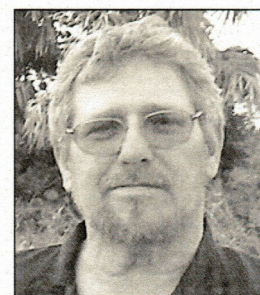


S. T. Joshi – S. T. is the author of such critical studies as *The Weird Tale* (1990), *H. P. Lovecraft: The Decline of the West* (1990), and *The Modern Weird Tale* (2001). He has prepared corrected editions of H. P. Lovecraft's work for Arkham House and annotated editions for Penguin



Classics. His exhaustive biography, *H. P. Lovecraft: A Life* (1996), won the British Fantasy Award and the Bram Stoker Award from the Horror Writers Association; an unabridged and updated edition has appeared as *I Am Providence: The Life and Times of H. P. Lovecraft* (2010). He has also written on atheism, politics, and race relations.

Allen Koszowski – Allen is a World Fantasy Award winning artist whose work has appeared in many hundreds of SF/Horror/Fantasy publications since 1973 including *Whispers*, *Weirdbook*, *Fantasy & Science Fiction*, *Midnight House*, *Analog*, *Weird Tales*, *Pioneer Books*, *Subterranean Press* and many more. He has been the artist guest of honor at The World Fantasy Convention, The World Horror Convention, The Necronomicon, The Killercon, The Keoghcon, Albacon and others. He is also the editor/publisher/

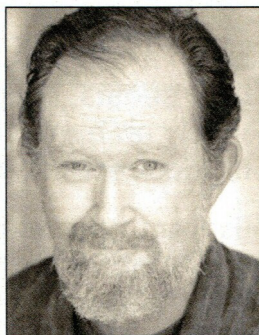


artist for *Inhuman* magazine. He has been married to his wife Christine for 38 years. They have two children and for now are living in the Philadelphia area.

Charlie Krank – Charlie started off as a beta-tester for Chaosium Games, then started to help with the graphic design of the products, and eventually progressed his way through the ranks to recently become President of the company. In 1981 Chaosium produced the *Call of Cthulhu* game, then *Shadows of Yog-Sothoth* and a subsequent line of adventures, source material, fiction, and a host of other products that have garnered Chaosium and the *Call of Cthulhu* line more than 70 awards for best game and best design. In 1996 Chaosium released the *Mythos* collectable card game, selling 22 million cards before the game was even completed.

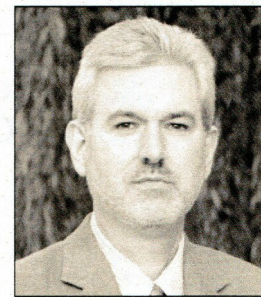


Andrew Leman – Andrew played an Investigator in the very first game of *Cthulhu Lives*, and has been hooked on Lovecraft ever since. Leman is one of the founding members of the H. P. Lovecraft Historical Society, and has co-produced numerous literary, film, theatrical, music and gaming projects there over the years, including *A Shoggoth on the Roof*, four episodes of *Dark Adventure Mystery Theatre*, two albums of Solstice carols, and the film adaptations of *The Call of Cthulhu* and *The Whisperer in Darkness*. He is the author of *In the Time of Lovecraft*, a non-scholarly history of the 1920s and '30s for HPL fans, and is the designer of highly authentic prop documents for *Call of Cthulhu* gamers.

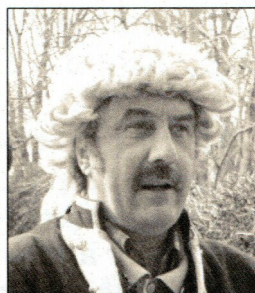


Donovan Loucks – Donovan has been the webmaster of The H. P. Lovecraft Archive (HPLovecraft.com) for over 15 years. His specialty is Lovecraft's geography and his photographs have most recently appeared in S.T. Joshi's

I Am Providence: The Life and Times of H. P. Lovecraft (Hippocampus Press) and *The Case of Charles Dexter Ward* (University of Tampa Press). Despite being a native of Phoenix and a resident there for over 40 years, Donovan now lives in Minnesota with his wife, Pam, and their two black cats. He plans to move to Lovecraft's hometown of Providence in the near future.



Danny Lovecraft – Charles "Danny" Alveric Lovecraft is a writer, versifier, editor, publisher, and devotee of the weird and fantastic. He owns P'rea Press (www.preapress.com) which publishes fantastic and weird poetry and non-fiction. Notable P'rea titles are by S.T. Joshi, R.L. Tierney and L. Blackmore. Charles's interest in the genre began in 1975 with the writings of H.P. Lovecraft. More recently he has extensively researched Australian weird poetry and, through

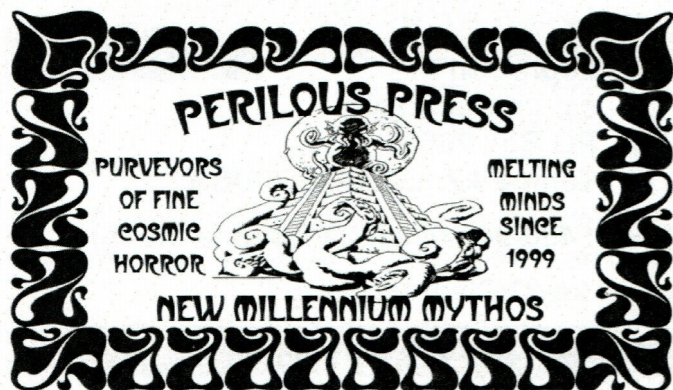



P'rea Press, intends to make it more accessible to the world. He is a member of AHWA, HWA, SFPA, and Australian Publishers Association. He lives in Sydney, Australia with his wife, Margaret.

Tom Lynch – Tom runs Miskatonic River Press as President of the company but he didn't want that job. Tom got involved in publishing when Doc first put out the call for content on yog-sothoth.com in 2008. Tom elbowed his way in, and found himself a partner in Miskatonic River Press, LLC...MRP for short. Several months later they produced one reprinted fiction anthology (*Dead But Dreaming*) and one original game book (*New Tales of the Miskatonic Valley*, featuring Tom's first published *Call of Cthulhu* scenario). Everyone was happy, and work was progressing on MRP's next game book but then Doc Herber, the CEO of the company, suffered a massive heart attack and passed away. Tom picked up and pressed forward, enlisting the help of prolific CoC writer, Oscar Rios. The two continue to keep the company running, and intend to do so through their ripe old age and beyond.



Tom needs to acknowledge his beautiful, beloved wife, Shau Yu. Without her, he'd never have been able to do this – Tom sometimes wonders why Shau Yu puts up with





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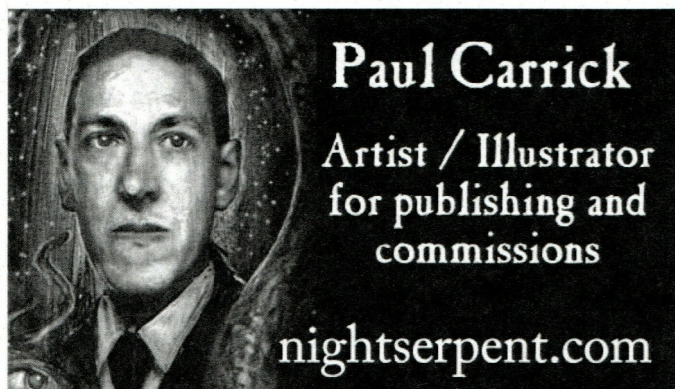
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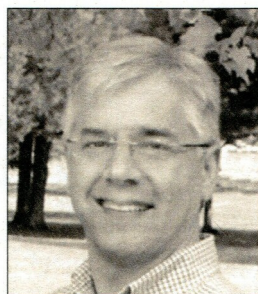
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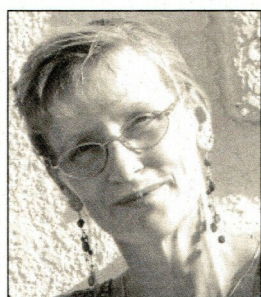


him, then realizes that it's best not to question such things and gets back to work on MRP's next project.

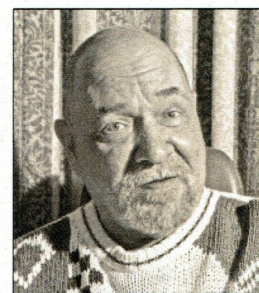

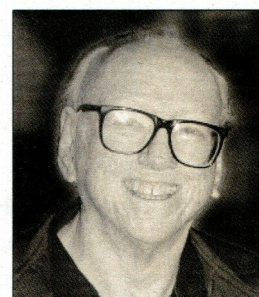

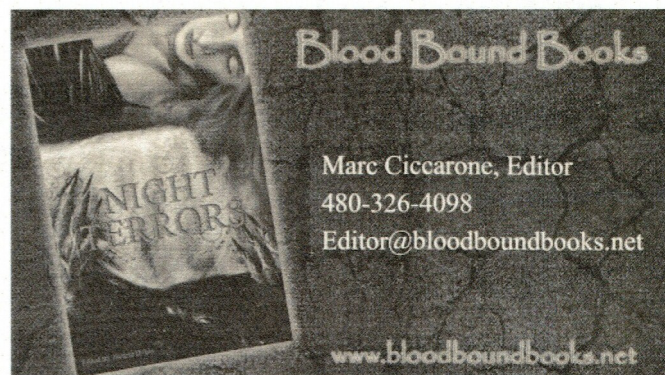

An artist, Nolan was born in Kansas City, Missouri, and worked at Hallmark Cards, Inc. and in comic books before becoming an author. 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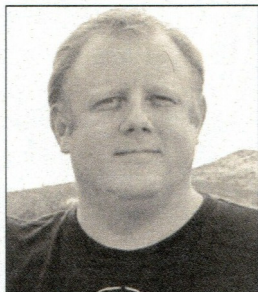
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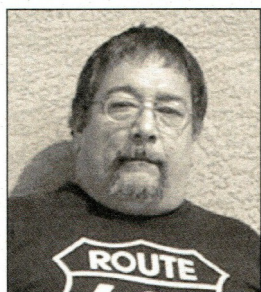
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America, Inc. in 2006, and receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Horror Writers Association in 2010. Nolan resides in Vancouver, WA.

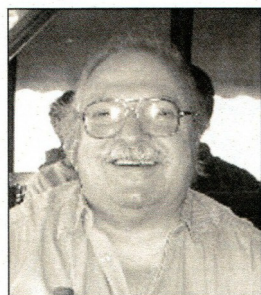
John Pelan – John is the author of several volumes of weird fiction and editor of over 40 books of material culled from the pulps and earlier sources. His new collection,

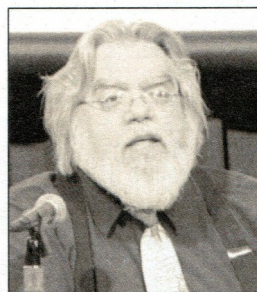
book-length collection of his poetry, *From the Cauldron* this December.

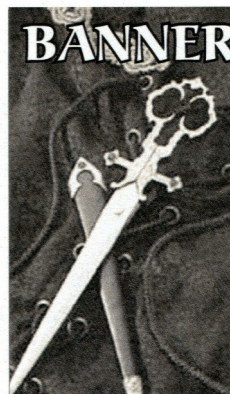
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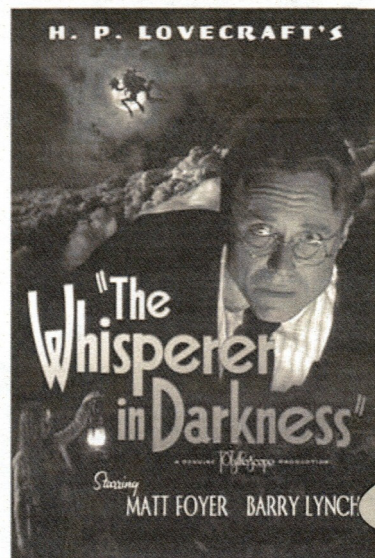




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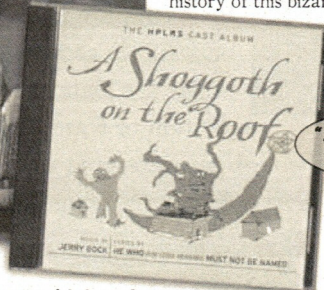
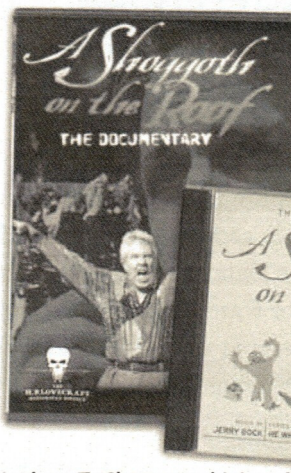
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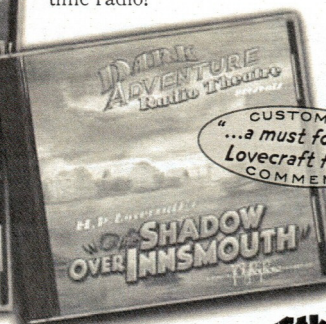
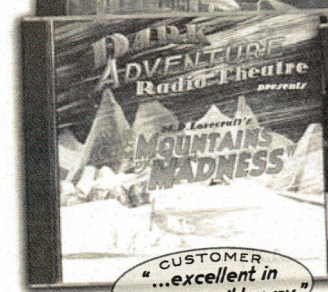
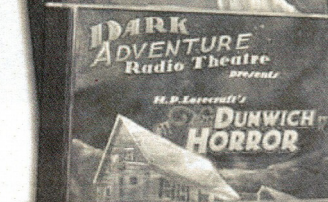
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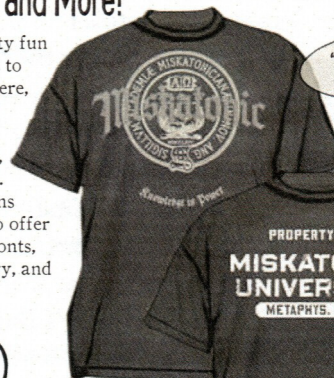


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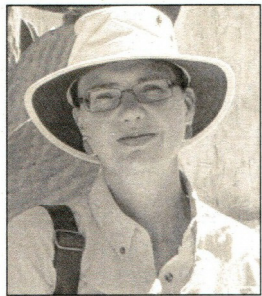
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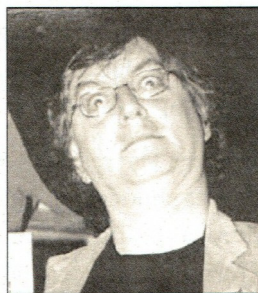
working on a new collection for Hippocampus Press, for which he hopes to write a 20,000 word sequel to “The Dunwich Horror.”

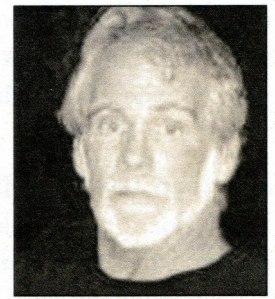

He is responsible for the blasphemous hymns printed in this program book, and is also the author of *The Mask of the Sorcerer*, *The Shattered Goddess*, *The White Isle*, *Sekenre The Book of the Sorcerer*, *Nightscares*, *Tom O’Bedlam’s Night Out*, *Necromancies and Netherworlds* (with Jason Van Hollander) and about 300 published fantastic stories, plus essays, interviews, poetry, etc. He was an editor of *Weird Tales* magazine for more years (1988-2007) though for fewer issues than Farnsworth Wright. He is a four-time nominee and one-time winner of the World Fantasy Award.

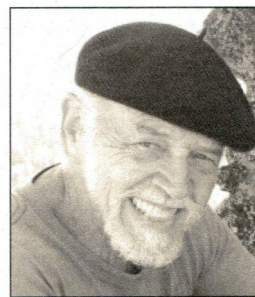


Michael Shea – Michael is an English instructor in

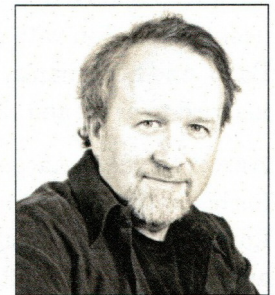

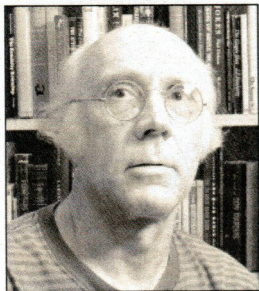

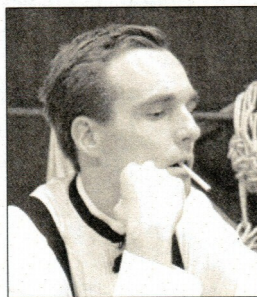
